

Data Analytics on Expenditure for Chronic Conditions

Subject

A suggestion was submitted for an analysis to be conducted on the total expenditure, total claims, and the number of individuals in Bermuda who had healthcare claims submitted to insurers for reimbursement.

- 1. The data is provided by the Bermuda Health Council and must be authorized prior to publication or use and if authorized, must be cited when published or used.
- 2. Bermuda Health Council does not make any guarantees or provide third party validation for the data sources.
- 3. The data provided is from claims data submitted to the Health Council by insurers for local and overseas claims (Note: this <u>excludes local hospital and subsidy claims</u> but includes overseas hospitals.). The original data is provided to the insurers by the health business submitting claims for the specified criteria outlined (i.e., conditions identified through diagnosis (ICD-9 or ICD-10) or procedure codes (CPT or local hospital charge codes)).
- 4. Fiscal year (FY) is 1st April to 31st March.
- 5. Data included from Argus, BF&M, CG, GEHI, HIP and FTC.
- 6. Data submitted to the Health Council by insurers does not include out-of-pocket expenses.
- 7. The data does not include claims rejected by insurers.
- 8. Note: Covid-19 may have impacted utilization of services from the time frame of March 2020, to current.
- 9. The Health Council is constantly looking to enhance the integrity of health system data which includes standardization of coding, improved accuracy of coding and streamlined data submission and review processes. As the health system becomes more familiar with coding standards, historical analyses may be impacted due to new information acquired through more accurate coding. In these cases, the most recent analysis of a dataset is the most accurate representation of the subject matter.










<u>Data</u>

The following tables and charts display expenditure, claim amounts, and the number of individuals with a primary diagnosis for a chronic health condition over the last few years for both local and overseas claims.



1.0 The following chart shows the local and overseas claim amounts on health conditions over the last few years.


